Del Norte and Tribal Lands Community Food Council was born of the Del Norte **Building Healthy Communities Initiative** funded by **The California Endowment**, which was a 10 year funding initiative to address health inequities across Del Norte County.

Community Food Council becomes part of the **Family Resource Center of the Redwoods**, with a focus on nutrition security and increasing access to healthy food through education, events, food policy, and building our local food economy.

Good Food Makes Us All Healthy Food Forest Grant with Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation helped establish food forests in Smith River, Crescent City, Klamath, and Weitchpec. The CFC still manages the Crescent City Food Forest located at College of the Redwoods Del Norte campus.

Crescent City- City Development Block Grant comes to DNATL CFC to run a choice based food pantry, **Pacific Pantry** at Family Resource Center of the Redwoods.



Established first-ever food rescue program in Del Norte, diverting edible food from the landfill to those in need, through our **Waste Not Weekly Program**. Start **Sea to Market** project to support small scale fishermen and increase access to local fish.



2019

4 new grant programs to address multiple sectors of the food system which includes **Beginning farmer and producer training & north coast land match, Klamath Promise Neighborhood for pathways to food system careers, Sea to Market fish file trailer for small scale fishermen, and Regional Food Systems Partnership for emergency food planning. Launched Food Council Steering Committee.**



Became the **second food bank** in Del Norte County and started the **Pacific Fresh Mobile Market** to serve our more remote, rural communities with fresh food. **Harvest Box** is launched, aggregating local products into a weekly subscription for local food.

DNATL CFC starts strategic planning to develop new 10 year plan. Family Resource Center of the Redwoods starts to take over lead on Food Bank and Emergency Food Distribution through Pacific Pantry and Mobile Pantry so CFC can focus on local food economy and education.
